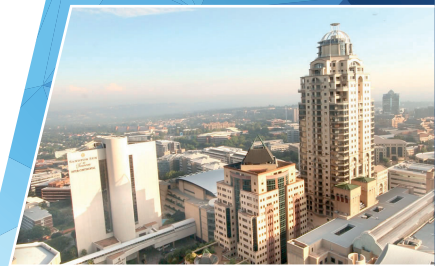

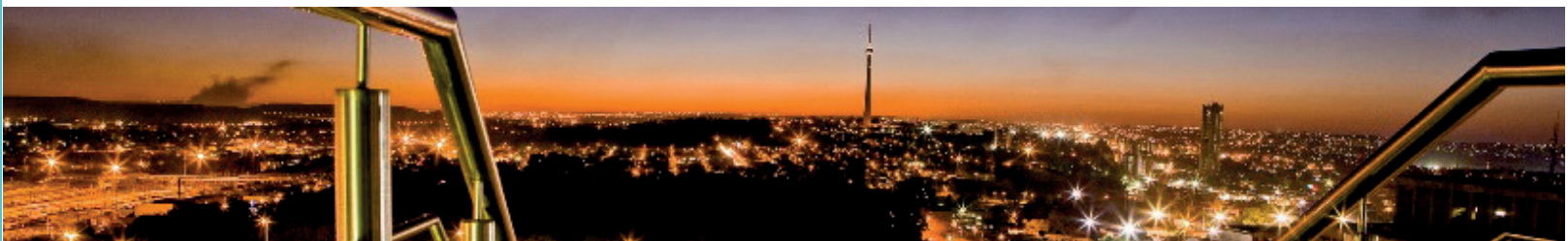

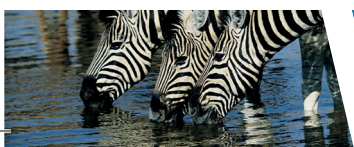

## INTERNATIONAL FACULTY

### ENT



#### Dr Michael Benninger

He is the Chairman of the Head and Neck Institute at The Cleveland Clinic and is a Professor of Surgery at the Cleveland Clinic Lerner College of Medicine of Case Western Reserve University. The Head and Neck Institute comprise the specialties of Otolaryngology, Audiology, Speech and Language Sciences, Oral Surgery and Dentistry. He is the President of the International Association of Phonosurgery, is the Treasurer of the American Broncho-Esophagological Association and Vice-President and a member of the Board of Directors of the Voice Foundation American

Rhinologic Society and the Michigan Oto-Laryngological Society.

Dr Benninger has authored or edited 8 books, including his most recent books, "The Performers Voice" and "Classics in Rhinology". He has 2 additional books in press. He has also written over 75 book chapters and over 190 scientific articles, focusing primarily on voice care and laryngology, nasal and sinus disease and health care management. He has lectured extensively across the country and throughout the world. A graduate of Harvard University, Dr Benninger received his medical degree from Case Western Reserve University in Cleveland, Ohio. He completed his residency at the Cleveland Clinic Foundation.



#### Dr Ricardo Carrau

He joined the Department of Otolaryngology - Head & Neck Surgery Department at The Ohio State University as a tenured Professor in Otolaryngology - Head & Neck Surgery in April 2011. He is the Director of the Comprehensive Skull Base Surgery Programme and Co-Director of the research and education laboratory **ALT-VISION (Anatomy Laboratory Toward Visuo-Spatial Innovations in Otolaryngology and Neurosurgery)**. The comprehensive skull base surgery programme is part of the Head & Neck Oncology Division at The James Cancer Hospital and the Solove Research Institute at The Ohio State University Medical Center (OSUMC) with ties to the Divisions of Rhinology and Neuro-Otology. Dr Carrau's clinical interests are diverse and include traditional and endoscopic skull base surgery, head and neck oncology, swallowing disorders, disorders of the salivary glands and sialendoscopy, disorders of the paranasal sinuses and endoscopic sinus surgery and laryngotracheal stenosis. Dr Carrau is a recognised world expert in skull base surgery and a pioneer in endoscopic skull base surgery. He has been instrumental in developing techniques, defining the indications, and solving many of the challenges presented by patients with pathologies in this complex area.



#### Dr Rolien Free

She is a Dutch ENT surgeon, who was trained at the University Medical Centre Groningen, The Netherlands by Professor Frans Albers. She specialised in Otology/ Neurotology and paediatric ENT surgery and has published several papers on cochlear implantation, otology and paediatric ENT subjects. Since 2010 she is co-director of the Cochlear Implant Team Northern Netherlands; her 10 year experience in both adult and paediatric cochlear implantation surgery is extensive. In 2011 and 2012 she worked as a neuro-otological fellow in Professor Mario Sanna's Gruppo Otologico in Piacenza, Italy. She has tutored several years with Professor Ugo Fisch in his otology and skull base microsurgery courses in Zurich, Switzerland and is tutoring in the Cochlear implant and Advanced temporal bone dissection course led by Professor Louis Hofmeyr in Pretoria, South Africa. She is currently secretary of CI-ON (National Committee of Dutch Cochlear Implant Teams) and of the Dutch Flemish Society for Paediatric Otorhinolaryngology.



#### Professor Erwin Offeciers

He is the Head of ENT Head and Neck Surgery at St Augustinus Hospital in Antwerp, Belgium. His main interests include cochlear implant surgery, cholesteatoma and reconstructive middle ear surgery as well as many others. Professor Offeciers is a member of the Belgian Society of Oto-Rhino-Laryngology, a founding member of the Flemish-Dutch ENT Society and the European Academy of ORL/ HNS. He has published more than 155 peer reviewed journal articles, 9 book chapters and has given over 130 live surgical demonstrations in 14 countries including South Africa as part of our faculty in 2014. Professor Offeciers was awarded the Order of Orange Nassau by the Kingdom of the Netherlands in 2015.





**Dr Elizabeth Toh**

A successful academic surgeon, Elizabeth Toh, is the Head of Otolaryngology and Neurotology at the Lahey Clinic. She directs all aspects of hearing and vestibular health care including implantable hearing devices and skull base surgery. Previously, Elizabeth was educated in Singapore where she grew up, trained in the United States and started her career at the University of Pittsburgh. Recently started her role as the co-director of the American Academy of Otolaryngology's Asian Outreach Programme where she will develop relationships with key otolaryngologists in these countries to develop educational programmes, obtain manufacturing support to provide needed equipment and develop government relations to ensure affordable sustainable health care for all citizens. She has recently completed her MBA from MIT.



**Professor Dr Gilbert Nolst Trenité**

He is an international well known authority on rhinoplastic surgery. In his enthusiasm for facial plastic surgery, and in particular for rhinoplasty, he has given many lectures and live surgery demonstrations on the subject all over the world. He has designed various specific rhinoplasty instruments. He is the editor of "Rhinoplasty", a practical guide to functional and aesthetic surgery of the nose. The third edition came with an interactive DVD ROM with 4 hours of live surgery. A Spanish edition is just on the market. He established an annual International Course on Modern Rhinoplasty Techniques in Amsterdam, which has been continued (from 2014 on) in Utrecht. He was the guest of honour at many international courses and meetings and became honorary member of several national ENT societies (among others, the South African ENT Society). Professor Nolst Trenité is, as past-president of the European Academy of Facial Plastic Surgery, a member of their executive board and past- president of the International Federation of Facial Plastic Surgery Societies.



**Professor Peter Weber**

He is currently Professor and Head of the Ear Institute and Neurotology/Skull Base Surgery for the Mt Sinai System. Prior to this was Professor and Head at the University of Massachusetts while serving as Cochlear's Chief Medical Officer. Prior to this he was Professor and Programme Director at the Cleveland Clinic and before that Professor and Interim Chair and Vice Chair at the Medical University of South Carolina. He trained in Otolaryngology at the University of Pittsburgh and completed his fellowship in Neurotology/Skull Base Surgery at the University of Iowa. He is board certified in both. In addition, he received his MBA from Duke University, his MD degree with distinction in research from Albany Medical College and an engineering BS/MS degree from Washington University in St Louis. He has published over 100 articles in peer reviewed literature, written three books, multiple book chapters and has had NIH sponsored research. He has been very active in the Academy of Otolaryngology; serving on its Board of Directors, past chairman of the Board of Governors and many other committees, including the RUC, CPT and PERC. He has received numerous national and local honours. He serves as editor-in-chief of the American Journal of Otolaryngology. He enjoys volunteer medical missions. He has established several cochlear implant programmes and has performed over 2000 implants.



**Professor Tucker Woodson**

He has dual board certification in Otolaryngology-Head and Neck Surgery and Sleep Medicine. He is a nationally and internationally recognised expert in Obstructive Sleep Apnea Syndrome. He has lectured worldwide on issues related to surgery and sleep medicine. He has served on the Standards of Practice Committee, and Quality and Outcomes working groups for the American Academy of Sleep Medicine; the Programme Advisory committee and Sleep disorders committee for the American academy of Otolaryngology, and the exam committee of the Board of Sleep Medicine. He is past president of the international surgical sleep society and has served on many national and international leadership positions related to sleep and sleep surgery. His research interest includes assessment of upper airway structure and ventilatory function and developing innovative methods to improve upper airway reconstructive techniques. He has co-edited and co-authored books on sleep apnea "Snoring and Sleep Apnea" and "Advanced Techniques in Surgery of Sleep Apnea" and authored over 130 articles, manuscripts, and book chapters related to sleep medicine.

**Professor Dr Friedrich Bootz**

Member in different scientific societies. 2001-2002 President of German society of computer and robotic aided surgery. 2002-2003 President of German society of plastic and reconstructive surgery. 2003-2005 President of German society of skull base surgery. 2007-2008 President of German society of otorhinolaryngology head and neck surgery. 2009-2012 General secretary of German society of otorhinolaryngology head and neck surgery. Honorary member of different medical societies. Advisory board of different medical journals. Publications: Original publications: 187; Contribution to books: 65; Books: 13.



**Professor Dr Stefan Dazert**

He is Professor and Chairman of the Department of Otorhinolaryngology & Head and Neck Surgery, Ruhr-University Bochum since 2005. He received his clinical and scientific training at the Departments of ORL & HNS at the Universities of Würzburg and Essen. In addition, he performed a DFG research fellowship at the University of California San Diego (USA) in the field of inner and middle ear biology. He has a broad expertise in surgical procedures in the field of ORL & HNS, in particular in middle ear, temporal bone and lateral skull base surgery including infectious diseases and implantable hearing devices. His main research interests include clinical investigations of indication and outcome of implantable hearing systems, as well as research projects to evaluate criteria for auditory neuron survival and neurite extension to potentially improve cochlear implant efficacy. He presented his work in numerous international meetings and is author of more than 130 articles in national and international journals and book chapters. Professor Dazert is secretary of the German Society of ORL & HNS, chancellor CME of the German ENT Association and member of the Editorial Board of Laryngo Rhino Otologie. In 2009, he was a founding member of the Master of Medicine Programme in Otorhinolaryngology awarded by the University of Rwanda and continuously supports this project as a lecturer and surgical trainer.



**Professor Dr Thomas Deitmer**

Since 1996 Professor Dr. med. Thomas Deitmer is head of the department of ORL-HNS at Klinikum Dortmund, a big community hospital. He passed medical school at the university of Münster, Germany, and was trained as a resident at the university-ENT-department of the same university. Board certification in 1985. His PhD-thesis was on several aspects of mucociliary transport in ENT in 1987. In 1993 he was appointed extraordinary professor of the Münster university. His special clinical interest is endonasal surgery and laryngo-tracheal surgery in children and adults besides covering the whole spectrum of ENT of a big department. He built up interdisciplinary skull base surgery in Dortmund with the neurosurgical department overlooking more than 300 acoustic neuromas and other skull base tumors. He was member of the board of the German Society of ORL-HNS from 2007 to 2015 and president of this Society in 2013 and 2014. In 2014 he was a founding member of the German working group for paediatric ENT.



**Professor Dr Klaus-Wolfgang Delank**

He is Professor of Otorhinolaryngology, Head and Neck Surgery and since 2000 director of the Department of ORL-HNS at the Klinikum Ludwigshafen, which is a tertiary referral institution and one of the largest academic hospitals in the South-West of Germany (www.kilu.de) His areas of expertise encompass amongst others the repair of traumatic lesions and cancer defects of the face, the management of orbital diseases and the reconstruction of the skull base. Over the last two decades he has conducted research on various themes of clinical otorhinolaryngology.



Based on this experience he is actively involved in educational programmes and training courses for emergency doctors and paramedics. Moreover, his responsibilities include teaching and managing of medical students, residents and postgraduates of the medical Universities of Münster, Mainz and Mannheim. He belongs to numerous national and international medical societies and is currently a member of the executive board of the German Society of ORL-HNS.



#### Professor Dr Andreas Dietz

Since April 2004 Professor Dr Andreas Dietz is director of the ENT Department, University hospital of Leipzig. He is a fully trained head & neck, ears nose and throat surgeon with specialties in head and neck oncology (Most of the training at University of Heidelberg 1992 – 2004). In the context of numerous studies his scientific work concentrated on head and neck tumours. He is internationally well known as an expert in the field of head and neck cancer. Since 2001 Professor Dietz is a member of the executive board of the working committee Oncology of the German Society for otorhinolaryngology, head and neck surgery. Since 2013 he was elected as member of the presidential council of the German Society for otorhinolaryngology, head and neck surgery. He is active in numerous committees, such as the German Society of Cancer, European Laryngeal Society and EORTC Head and Neck group. He is member of honour of the Royal Belgian ENT society, Austrean ENT society and the Indian Head and Neck foundation. He is an affiliated member of board of directors in the "Global Online Fellowship initiative" Sloan Kettering Memorial Cancer Center New York and chair of the subcommittee surgery of the EORTC Head and Neck Group. Andreas Dietz is author/co-author of more than 400 pub-med listed peer reviewed papers.



#### Dr Dirk Heinrich

He is serving as President of the German Association of ENT Surgeons since 2008 and a member of the Board of Directors of the German ENT Society. He is also President of the German Association of Medical Specialists (SpiFa), the top German organisation which represents all German specialised physicians. SpiFa has more than 100 000 members of all disciplines. In this function he is involved in all political and legislative processes in Germany and in the European Union. Despite these functions Dr. Heinrich is still an attending ENT Surgeon at St. Marys Hospital in Hamburg Germany and the senior partner in the ENT Clinic of Hamburg-Horn. Commander Heinrich is a reserve officer of the German Navy and reserve chief of the ENT Department of the Hospital of the Armed Forces in Hamburg. He received his medical training at the University of Freiburg, Germany and the New York State university, USA. He served as ENT Specialist in several hospitals before founding the ENT Clinic in Hamburg-Horn. He is also heading the ENT Associations initiative in Rwanda. This venture concentrates on the education of Rwandan ENT Surgeons together with the University of Rwanda ENT Department at CHUK in Kigali since 2009. In this position he has visited Rwanda more than ten times. The Rwandan project is also headed by his friend and colleague Professor Dr Stefan Dazert, who is also part of the International Faculty of ENT 2016 in South Africa.

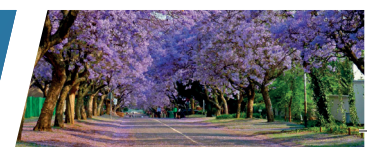

#### Professor Louise Hickson

She is also Chair of the Ida Institute Advisory Board in Denmark and an Editor of the International Journal of Audiology. She is widely published in communication disorders in culturally and linguistically diverse populations, has received numerous grants and has presented at numerous congresses around the world including in Kenya, Brazil, Greece, Switzerland, and Denmark.



**Professor Rhea Paul**

Ph.D., CCC-SLP. She is Professor and Chair of Speech-Language Pathology at Sacred Heart University. She has served as an Editor at the Journal of Speech-Language, and Hearing Research. She is author of over 100 refereed journal articles, over 50 book chapters, and 9 books.

Professor Paul has served as Principal Investigator on grants from the National Institutes of Health, the American Speech-Language-Hearing Foundation, Autism Speaks, and the Meyer Memorial Trust. She has been elected Vice President for Programme for both the Oregon and Connecticut Speech-Language Hearing Associations, and was President of the Connecticut Speech-Language Hearing Association (CSHA) from 2010-14. Winner of the National 1996 Editor's Award of the American Journal of Speech-Language Pathology, and the Slifka Foundation Award for Clinical Research from the International Society for Autism Research in 2010, she received Honours of the Association in 2014 from both the Connecticut Speech, Language, and Hearing Association and ASHA. She was also awarded Annual Faculty Scholarship Award for her book, Let's Talk: Navigating Social Communication Supports for Your Young Child with Autism from Sacred Heart in 2016.



**Professor Lesley Wolk**

She received her degree in Speech Therapy and Audiology from the University of the Witwatersrand, South Africa, in 1977. After one year of clinical experience at Baragwaneth Hospital, she returned to the University to pursue her Master's degree in Speech Pathology, which she received cum laude in 1982. She then served as lecturer and clinical supervisor at the University of the Witwatersrand before going to the U.S. where she earned her doctoral degree from Syracuse University in 1990. Her primary areas of interest are in stuttering in both children and adults, phonological disorders, voice pathologies, and adult neurogenic communication disorders. She has presented numerous papers both nationally and internationally, has published many scientific articles and a book chapter on co-existing phonological disorders and stuttering. She has held academic positions as Associate Professor, including University of Connecticut, Columbia University, Long Island University, and Southern Connecticut State University. She has also had extensive clinical experience including supervision of student clinicians and direct clinical contact with both children and adults. Together with others, she pioneered the work on comorbidity related to phonological disorders and stuttering in young children.

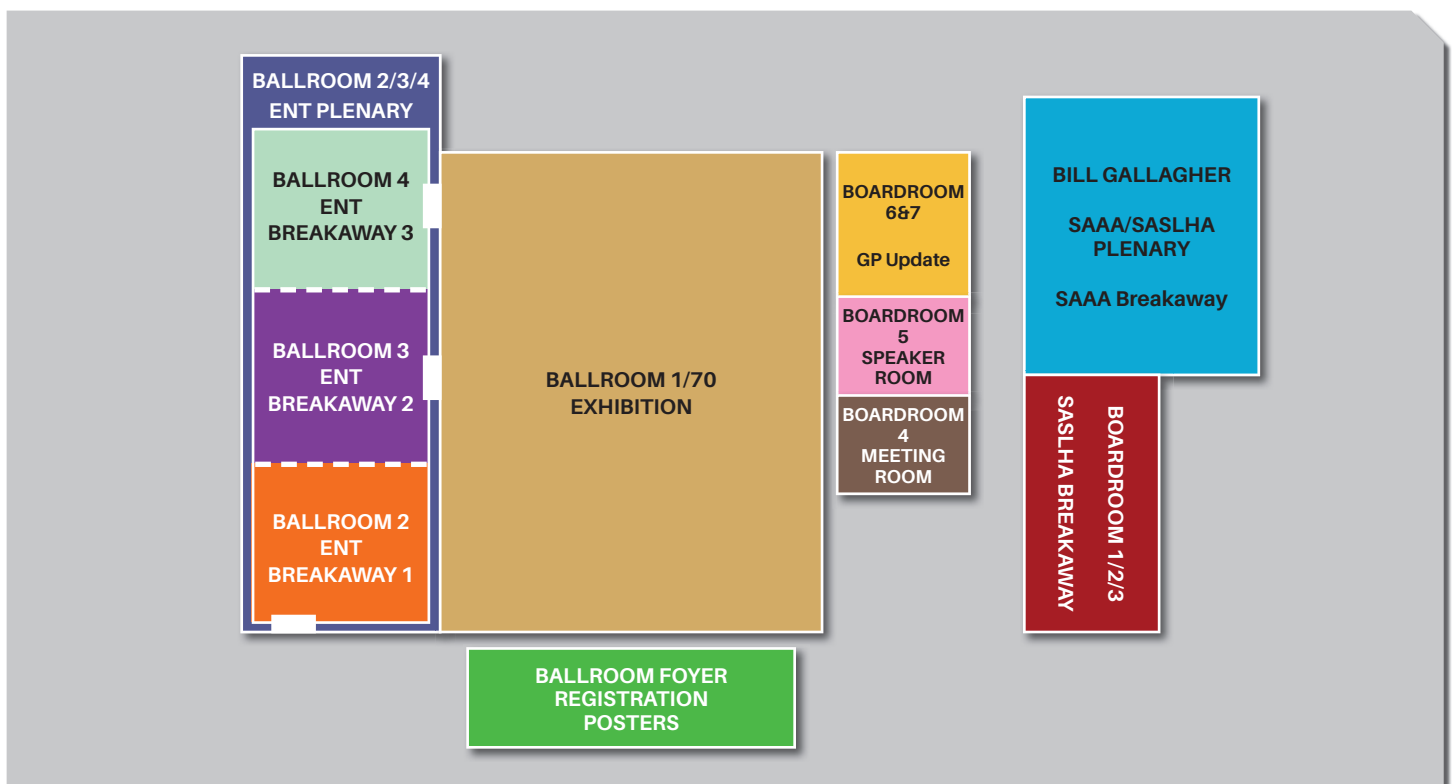

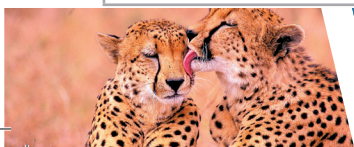
