## International Faculty

### ENT



#### Prof Devendra Chaukar

Professor Devendra Chaukar is Head of Department of Head and Neck surgery at the Tata Memorial Hospital Mumbai, India. He completed his Masters in Surgery in 1998 and then received training in Oncosurgery. He specialised in Head and Neck surgery and joined as faculty at the same hospital in 2002. His areas of interests are conservative laryngeal surgery and issues related to quality of life. He received the prestigious Hargobing fellowship for training in advanced laser surgery at Kiel, Germany. He has authored more than 50 publications in various national and international journals and also published book chapters. Prof Chaukar is a principle investigator on industry and investigator initiated trials.



#### Prof Hisham Khalil

Professor Hisham Khalil is a Consultant Rhinologist at Derriford Hospital, Plymouth, UK since 2004. His special surgical interests include Endoscopic Sinus, Anterior Skull Base Surgery and Surgery for Nasal Obstruction. Hisham completed his specialist training in Otolaryngology in the South West of England. He was a Fellow of the late Professor Wolfgang Draf, in Fulda, Germany in 2003. Hisham also has an interest in Undergraduate and Postgraduate Medical Education, Clinical and Educational Research. He is the Director of Clinical Studies and Inter-professional Learning for the Plymouth University Peninsula Schools of Medicine and Dentistry. Hisham chairs the Specialist Training Committee in Otolaryngology for the South West Peninsula in England. He is also the ENT Clinical Research Network Lead for the South West Peninsula and an External Assessor for the Irish Medical Council. Hisham has a Doctorate Degree (MD) in Otolaryngology and a Masters in Clinical Education in addition to being a Fellow of the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Glasgow and Royal College of Surgeons

in Ireland. He has numerous publications in the field of Rhinology and is one of the Assistant Editors of the Journal of Laryngology and Otology. Hisham has had a number of awards including the ENT trainer of the year for the South West of England in 2009, the Peninsula Deanery Innovation Fund in 2012 and the Plymouth University Teaching Fellowship in 2014. Hisham is married with 2 daughters. He writes English poetry and has an interest in landscape photography.



#### Prof Vincent Vander Poorten

Vincent Vander Poorten, MD, PhD, MSc (Epid) is Consultant, Full Professor and Deputy Clinical Head of Otorhinolaryngology, Head and Neck Surgery at the University Hospitals Leuven, Leuven, Belgium. He is Department Head of Head and Neck Oncology of the Department of Oncology of the faculty of Medicine at KU Leuven. He earned a degree

of 'Master of Science in Epidemiology' at the Free University of Amsterdam, Amsterdam, the Netherlands (1998). He defended his PhD thesis 'Salivary gland carcinoma. Stepping up the prognostic ladder' and earned the Degree of Doctor in Medicine at the Universiteit van Amsterdam, Amsterdam, the Netherlands (2002). He is a member of The Netherlands Epidemiological Society, The Royal Belgian Society for Otorhinolaryngology, Head and Neck Surgery, the Netherlands Society for Otorhinolaryngology and Cervicofacial Surgery, the American Head and Neck Society, The Flemish Head and Neck Society (Past President and current Secretary), the International Academy on Oral Oncology, the International Head and Neck Scientific Group, the International Federation of Head and Neck Oncological Societies (IFHNOS), the European Salivary Gland Society (ESGS – founding member), the European Academy of Facial Plastic Surgery, the International Association of Endocrine Surgeons, the AOCMF (Aktiongesellschaft für Osteosynthesefragen – craniomaxillofacial group), the British Association of Head and Neck Oncologists, and the European Head and Neck Society. His area of expertise is head and neck oncology and surgery, with a specific focus on salivary gland and thyroid surgery, laser microendoscopic surgery, endoscopic and external approaches to the anterior skull base and pediatric head and neck surgery.





**Prof Dr Narayanan Prepageran**

MBBS (UM), MS (ORL, Distinction, UM), USMLE (US), FRCS (Edin), ORL-HNS FRCS (Glasg), FAAOHNS (US), Fellowship in Neurotology/Otology (Canada), AM (Mal). Professor Dr Prepageran started his career with MBBS University Malaya in 1993. His area of expertise includes Otorhinolaryngology, Head & Neck Surgery, Advanced Endoscopic Sinus

Surgery, Endoscopic Skull Base Surgery, Otology, Neurotology, Skull Base Surgery and Cochlear Implants. He worked abroad in the UK under the sponsorship of the Royal College of Surgeons of England (Certificate of Completion of Training) in 1998-1999 and Clinical Fellowship in Neurotology & Advanced Otology, Skull Base Surgery (Nov 2002–Nov 2003) in Toronto General Hospital, University Health Network, University of Toronto. He is currently Professor and Head of Department of Otorhinolaryngology, Head & Neck Surgery, Faculty of Medicine, University Malaya and past Chairman of the National Otorhinolaryngology Head & Neck Surgery Specialty Training Board. He is very actively involved in research with numerous research grants. He is also a fellow of the Royal College of Surgeons of Edinburgh and the Royal College of Surgeons of Glasgow. He is also a member of the Court of Examiner in Masters in ENT in Malaysia, MRCS Edinburgh and has been an external examiner for numerous Master's thesis and PhD and currently supervises PhD students. He has been the external examiner of the Singapore Masters ENT Examination in 2011, 2012 and 2014. He has been awarded numerous local and international awards including the Excellent Service Award and the Certificate of Merit for Distinguished Service, as well as the Distinction in Masters in Otolaryngology, all by the University of Malaya. He is currently part of the Editorial Board and Reviewer of more than 15 journals (Local & International).

**Prof Ishara Ramkissoon**

Prof Ishara Ramkissoon is Associate Professor in the Department of Speech Pathology & Audiology, and Affiliate Faculty in the Gulf Coast Behavioral Health & Resiliency Center at the University of South Alabama. She received her PhD degree in 2005 and a Master's degree (Audiology) in 1994, both from the University of Illinois. After receiving her Bachelor's degree in Speech and

Hearing Therapy from the University of Durban-Westville in 1989, she began her clinical career at Baragwanath Hospital in Soweto. Prof Ramkissoon is certified in Audiology (CCC-A) by the American Speech Language Hearing Association since 1995. Her clinical practice in the United States and in South Africa has included hospital, ENT clinic, special education, university clinic, and community health based rehabilitation sites. Prof Ramkissoon currently teaches graduate students in the audiology clinical doctorate (AuD) program at the University of South Alabama. Her teaching includes coursework in aging, basic assessment, evoked potentials, adult audiologic rehabilitation, medical audiology, and pediatric diagnostics. Prof Ramkissoon's research focuses on factors that impact human hearing and communication skills, including aging, smoking, and language background. Several projects are currently active in her research laboratory. Prof Ramkissoon's research has been supported by extramural and intramural grants. She is

Program Director for the Environmental Literacy and the Health Impact of Pollution project, funded by the Gulf Region Health Outreach Program which also supports two graduate assistants in her laboratory. Prof Ramkissoon is a reviewer for national and international journals in audiology and public health. She serves as Vice-President of the Board of Trustees for Mercy Medical, a healthcare facility providing home health, hospice, and community based long term care for the elderly in Alabama.



**Prof Vishakha Rawool**

Vishakha Rawool holds a master's degree in speech-language-pathology from University of Texas at El Paso and a PhD with emphasis in Audiology & Hearing Sciences from Purdue University. She has also completed a post-doctoral fellowship at Johns Hopkins University. She is currently a Professor in the Department of Communication Sciences & Disorders

at West Virginia University and teaches academic courses including courses related to hearing conservation and auditory processing disorders. She has several publications to her credit including text books titled 'Hearing Conservation In Occupational, Recreational, Educational, and Home Settings (2012, Thieme)' and 'Auditory Processing Deficits: Assessment and Intervention (2014, Thieme). She has extensive clinical experience in providing comprehensive audiological services to all populations including infants and older adult.

**Speech-Language Pathology**



**Prof Alejandro Brice**

Prof Alejandro Brice worked as a school based speech-language pathologist from 1987 to 1989 and in private practice from 1993 to 1995. Prof Brice has been a member of the American Speech-Language-Hearing Association (ASHA) for 31 years. Prof Brice is a Full Professor at the University of South Florida, St. Petersburg. He is the 2008 recipient

of the Certificate of Recognition for Special Contributions in Multicultural Affairs of the American Speech-Language-Hearing Association. He is also the recipient of the 2011 American Speech-Language Association Fellow Award. Prof Brice's primary research relates to aspects of speech and language among bilingual populations in individuals with and without disabilities. Prof Brice's research has focused on issues of transference or interference between two languages in the areas of phonetics, phonology, semantics, and pragmatics related to speech-language pathology and cognition. His clinical expertise relates to the appropriate assessment and treatment of Spanish-English speaking students and clients in the United States. Prof Brice has written 60 refereed articles, 21 book chapters, 2 published books, 2 monographs, and 62 other scholarly publications.



**Dr Roanne Brice**

Dr Roanne Brice, PhD, CCC-SLP is an ASHA certified Speech-Language Pathologist in the United States. Her research and clinical interests focus on language and literacy skills in individuals with disorders/disabilities, including those who are English Learners (EL). Dr Brice conducts research in acquired traumatic brain injuries and subarachnoid

hemorrhages. Numerous publications include journal articles, book chapters and a co-edited book. She has clinical experience working with children, adolescents, adults, and families in the school and medical settings. She has eight years of clinical and school-based professional experience as an itinerant and self-contained classroom speech-language pathologist/exceptional education teacher. Currently, Dr Brice's academic position focuses on university administration as the Director for Accreditation, Assessment and Data Management in the College of Education and Human Performance at the University of Central Florida (UCF). In addition to her administrative responsibilities over the past 11 years at UCF, Dr Brice has taught undergraduate and graduate courses preparing professionals to work with children and adolescents with disabilities and communication disorders.



**Ms Tessa Goldsmith**

Tessa Goldsmith is a South African trained, Masters prepared Speech-Language Pathologist with over thirty years' experience in treating patients with swallowing disorders. She also investigates application of motor learning principles during dysphagia rehabilitation and is conducting studies that train clinicians who practice dysphagia management to be critical thinkers.



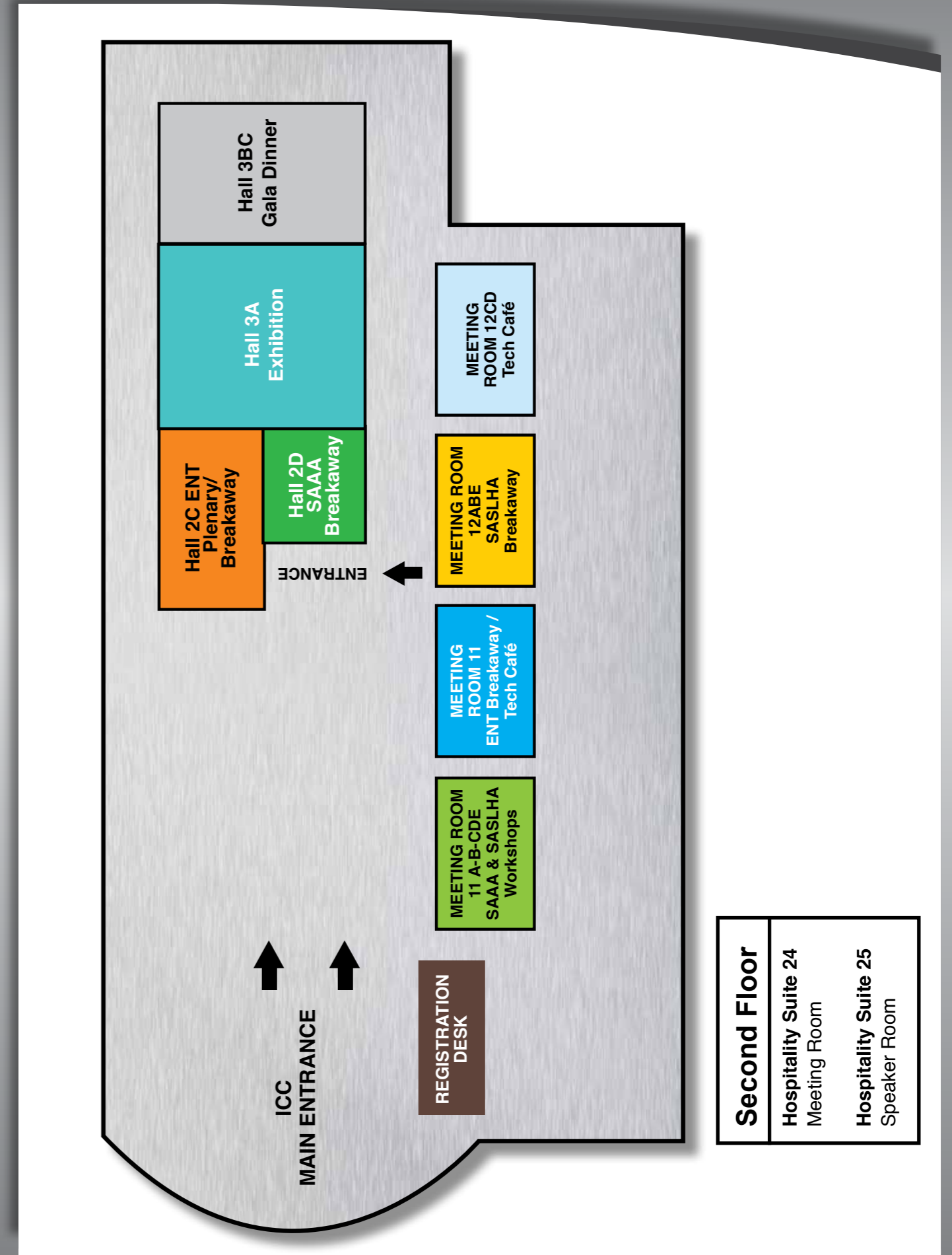

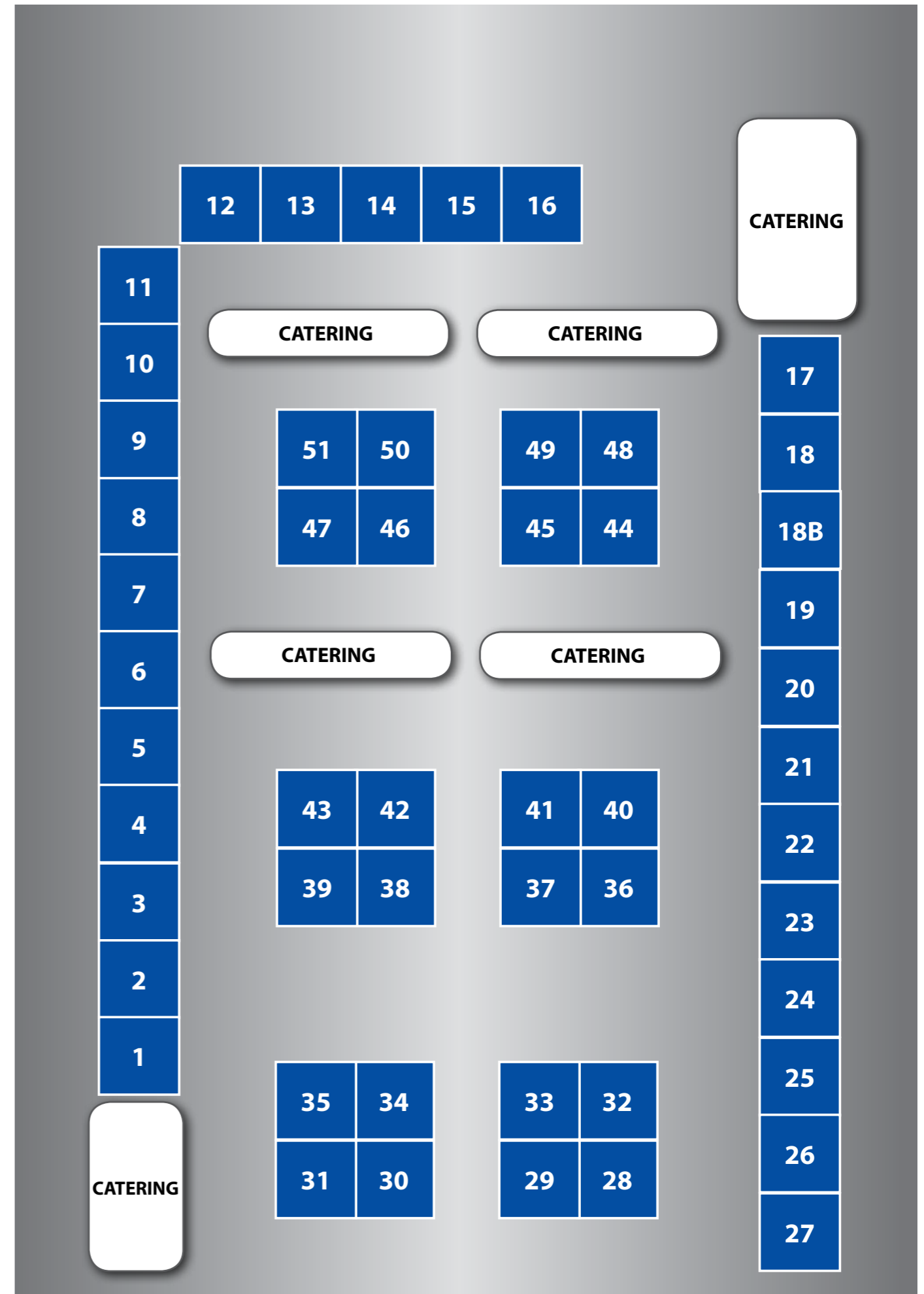
